From the Rectory Study

As you will see from this edition of the Parish magazine, November and December will be very busy months within Mossley Parish. In November we will have the GB enrolment, Remembrance Sunday and a concert with Bello Duo. Then as we enter December, we are delighted that our Christmas Fair will be held once again, our Nativity and Carol Services will take place and we will also have the usual extra provision that we offer during the season of Advent. On top of all of this, our parochial organisations will have special events and our Parish Centre continues to be extensively used. There is much for us to give thanks to God for and I do encourage us to regularly give thanks to God.

Every year, the journey towards Christmas Day is a busy one. For example, we seek to visit family and friends, there are carol services and nativities to attend, and we engage in Christmas shopping (and then the wrapping of gifts). Do you have a favourite part of the Christmas season? To be honest, I just love Christmas music. A few days ago, I saw a rather humorous picture of Mariah Carey. In that picture she appeared to be frozen and the caption said 'This is your warning. The Mariah Carey defrosting process has begun.' Of course, this was referring to the reality that before long the Christmas music will be in all the shops once again.

How about Christmas Carols? Do you have a particular favourite? In December 2020 the BBC programme Songs of Praise counted down the top ten Christmas Carols as voted for by viewers in a UK-wide online poll. Many of the old classics were included. *Away In A Manger* was number eight; *Once In Royal David's City* was ranked seventh; and *In The Bleak Midwinter* was third. The most popular Christmas Carol, according to this poll, was *O Holy Night*. One of my personal favourites, *Silent Night*, was second.

Silent Night was first heard on Christmas Eve 1818 in St. Nikola church, in the village of Oberndorf, near Salzburg, Austria. As we sing Silent Night, it takes us on a journey to the stable in Bethlehem, 2000 years ago, and it draws our attention to the child in the manger – the '...Holy infant so tender and mild.' This was no ordinary birth and the baby who lay in the manger was no ordinary child. This baby, Jesus, gave up the glory of heaven to be laid in that lowly manger. He came not to be served but to serve. He was God's gift for you and me, so that through believing in him we can draw close to God and become His children.

Corrie Ten Boom once reflected "Who can add to Christmas? The perfect motive is that God so loved the world. The perfect gift is that He gave His only Son. The only requirement is to believe in Him. The reward of faith is that you shall have everlasting life." The question for us, this Christmas time, is how will we respond to the wonder of Christ's birth?

On behalf of the Rectory family, may I also wish each of you a very blessed Christmas and a peaceful 2024.

Advent Services and Daily Reflections



Advent is an important time for Christians. It is a time of preparation as we celebrate Jesus' first coming and look forward to his return in glory. It is also a season of personal reflection, an occasion to take stock of our lives and seek to realign our lives with God's revealed plan for us.

This year, during the season of Advent, our daily Thoughts for the Day will return (each morning at 10am, except Sundays). These will be available on Facebook, YouTube, our website, and via the dial-in facility. The first Thought for the Day will be released on Monday 4th December and they will conclude on Christmas Eve.

We will also have three Advent Services this year. They will be on Wednesday evenings at 7pm in the church building, starting on Wednesday 6th December and concluding on Wednesday 20th December.

Online Services

We continue to offer Online Services and Bible Studies. These are made available on YouTube, Facebook, our website and the dial-in facility. Since the last edition of this magazine, our online provision has been watched almost 1500 times and this equates to an incredible 171.7 hours of watch time. Thank you to everyone who makes this possible and it really is a blessing to many people who join with us faithfully each week through the wonders of technology.



Each week, our online service is available on YouTube from 11am and it is then released on Facebook, our website and the dial-in facility at 12.30pm. As outlined above, we will have extra online provision during the season of Advent as our Thoughts for the Day return.

Bible Study

Our Bible Study continues to meet every Tuesday evening at 7.30pm in the Parish Centre and an Online Study is released at 7pm. It has been encouraging to see good numbers of people engage, either in-person or online, with our study programme.



This year we are looking at Mark's gospel and we have discovered that it really is an actionpacked book of the Bible. A biblical scholar called Ralph Earle suggests that "It might be said that, while Matthew and Luke furnish us with colorslides of the life of Christ and John presents a studied portrait, Mark gives us a moving picture of the Master's ministry." This has certainly proven to be the case.



In our studies, so far, we have reflected on how Jesus called his disciples and we have focused on some of his miracles. Our attention has also been drawn to how Jesus experienced opposition and we have pondered a series of reflective questions which get us thinking about our own journeys of faith.

Following the half-term break, the Bible Study will resume again on Tuesday 14th November and we will be looking at the fourth and fifth chapters of Mark's gospel. On Tuesday 12th December we will have our annual Christmas Study and this year it is entitled *'Love Came Down At Christmas.'* As ever, this will be followed by seasonal refreshments.

Harvest Thanksgiving

Freewill Offering and Building/Maintenance Fund Envelopes for 2024




Freewill Offering and Building/Maintenance Fund Envelopes for 2024 will be available at Sunday services from the Parish Centre during December 2023. You are kindly requested to collect your envelopes, and those of any parishioners who live close to you, as quickly as possible and so reduce the large volume of envelopes which are delivered by hand each year.

For economic reasons, the quantity of envelopes ordered has been reduced which means that for most people it will involve a change of envelope number in the New Year. This is because more and more parishioners now pay by Standing Order and as a result no longer require envelopes. This method of payment is particularly beneficial to the Parish in that it allows us to budget more efficiently when we know how much income we will have in any given month. We would encourage as many parishioners as possible to use this method for your church offering.

A Standing Order is very easy to set up. You simply decide how much you want to subscribe on a monthly basis and request a form from Mr Ken Jackson, our Parish Recorder. The completed form is then submitted to your bank/building society or you can set this up yourself if you bank online.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank parishioners for their generosity and ongoing support of Mossley Parish.

We are now in a position to be able to send a further £2000 to Tansen and £2000 to SAMS Ireland. The mission boxes continue to be a great source of income and we would like to thank everyone who contributes regularly to our mission partners through the use of these boxes.

We intend to host a soup and cheese lunch on Sunday 18th February and we are always looking for eager volunteers who could help us at this event. We are also planning to host further fundraising events (possibly a variety concert and a table quiz) in the springtime and more details will be available in the next edition of this magazine.

Last year we were absolutely delighted with the response to our Christmas Hamper Appeal and we intend to produce hampers again this year. The ongoing cost of living crisis means that many families in our community are struggling to pay energy bills and cope with rising food prices. Foodbanks continue to experience increased demands and quite often they don't have the necessary level of provision to meet the rising need.



In partnership with Mossley and Earlview Primary Schools we would like to offer some practical help by providing food hampers to families who are finding life difficult at this time. Everything that is donated to this appeal will go to those who need it the most. Just like last year, we aim to distribute the final hampers about one week before Christmas Day. It was such a blessing to see the joy in people's faces as they received a Christmas Hamper last year and we would love to be able to demonstrate the love of God to as many families as possible again this Christmas.

We will release a list of items for inclusion in the hampers on Sunday 5th November and we will also leave a basket in the church porch for these items to be left in. Alternatively, if anyone would like to contribute financially towards this project please speak with the Rector. All financial assistance will then be used to buy food items for inclusion in the hampers.
